

Graffiti Action Forum – Focal Points for Action – October 2012

1. Maintain support and full funding for a rapid and efficient graffiti eradication service
(currently GPC) available to all
2. Repair and make fully functional Tucson's citizen graffiti reporting system
3. Establish a justice watch program - court watch but broader (see: <http://www.watchmn.org/>)
 - a) open up public access to court procedural and sentencing information
 - b) coordinate neighborhood representation in judicial proceedings
 - c) promote comprehensive restitution through tough court decisions, use of civil processes and effective collections (see San Diego's program)
 - d) promote effective pre-trial release, diversion, plea offer and probation policies and programs
 - e) establish a basis for making judge retention recommendations
 - f) bring system problems to government for resolution
4. Refine, clarify and widely distribute graffiti information to citizens
5. Identify graffiti prone areas for high intensity prevention/cleaning/apprehension efforts
(a la Albuquerque)
6. Enhance property owner response to graffiti (private, public, utility and business)
7. Maintain high level publicity on all parts of Tucson's graffiti response system
8. Support community arts and other programs that help diversion and protect likely graffiti targets (see programs in Tucson, San Antonio and San Diego)
